

Coolidge Junior High School 2013-2014 ISAT Information

The following “companion statement” for Coolidge Junior High School is being delivered to all parents based on ISAT/PSAE data submitted to local districts by the Illinois State Board of Education. As you investigate our school’s performance, we want to emphasize the continued efforts to improve our scores both as a school and as a district. Due to the change in cut-scores incorporated into the ISAT testing program last spring, this effort is not fully represented in looking at the testing results. Information has been provided to parents regarding this change implemented by the Illinois State Board of Education.

Areas of Success

- Continued implementation of the Common Core State Standards into classroom practices and the creation of a more rigorous curriculum
- Alignment both vertically and horizontally of the curriculum throughout the district and specifically at the 7th and 8th grade levels
- Data-based decision making utilizing Discovery Education assessment and evaluation tools to focus on student growth and provide a vehicle to improve instruction in the classroom
- Offering a Reading Enhancement and Math Enhancement elective class at the Junior High level to provide additional instruction in these core areas of learning
- Alignment of the Junior High eligibility guidelines with that of the IHSA High School guidelines to promote the relationship between athletics and academics
- Truancy program utilizing district Truant Officers to reinforce importance of attendance
- Continuation of the Teen Reach program providing both an academic and social skills component for students before and after school
- District website promoting increased communication with community, staff, and parents. This includes the use of Skyward, web based data software, which allows parents access to every facet of their child’s education

Areas for Planned Improvement

- Raise adequate yearly progress in Mathematics and Reading as we did not meet AYP (92.5%)
- Utilize the Math and Reading elective classes to reinforce skills and concepts to help improve our overall AYP in these areas
- Continue to provide professional development throughout the year for staff in order to increase the continuity and rigor of the curriculum
- Raise our attendance rate. We fell slightly under the expectation of (92%) with an attendance rate of (91.2%)
- Continue the use of our Truancy Interventionists within the district to promote good attendance and cooperation with families
- Focus on the use of positive incentives for students to recognize their accomplishments both academically and attendance at school
- Continue to promote positive choices through our Character Council/Charter Plus student organization
- Continue to provide quality services to students through our Student Assistance Coordinator

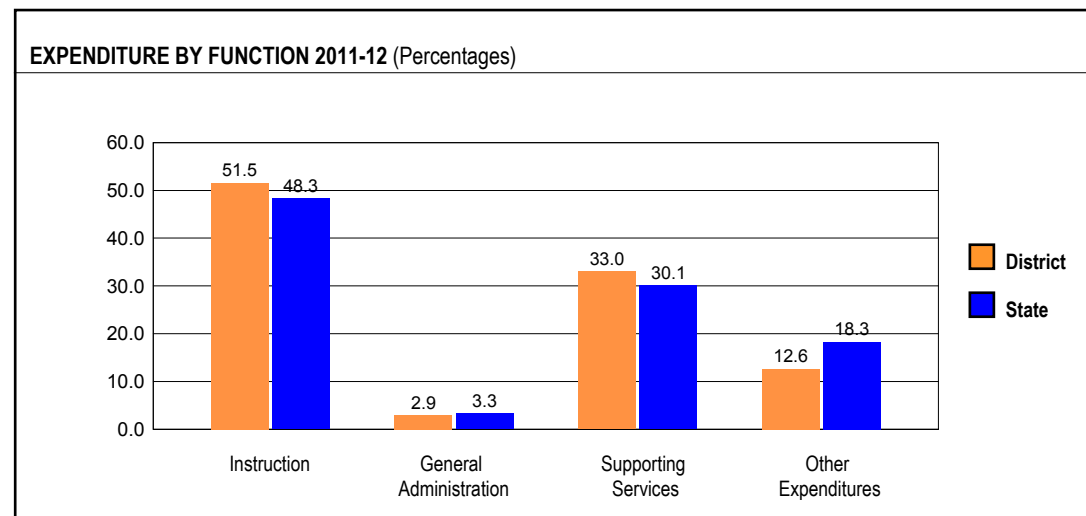

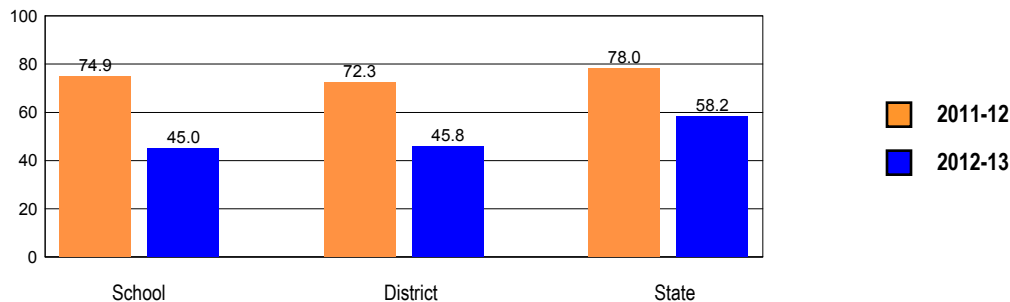

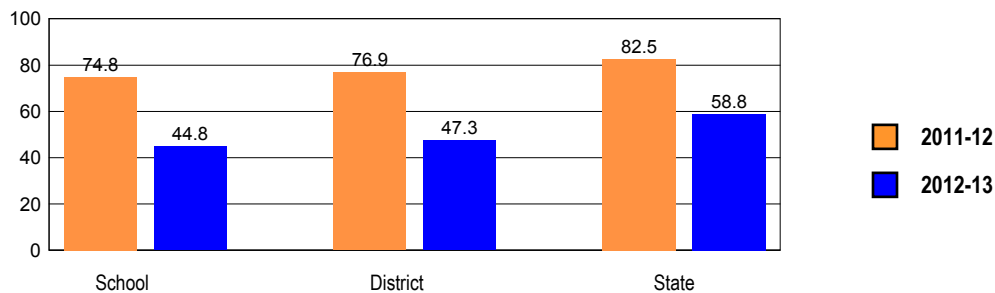

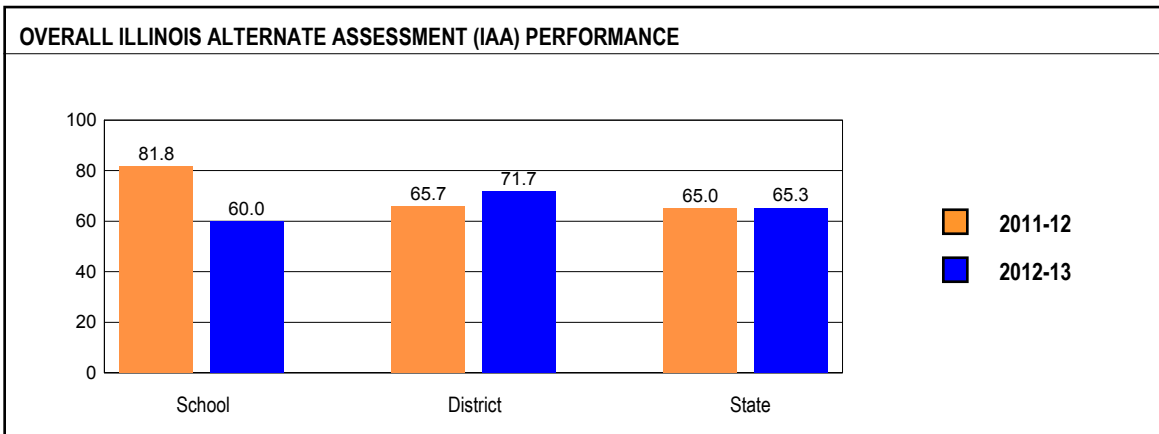

OVERALL ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT) PERFORMANCE

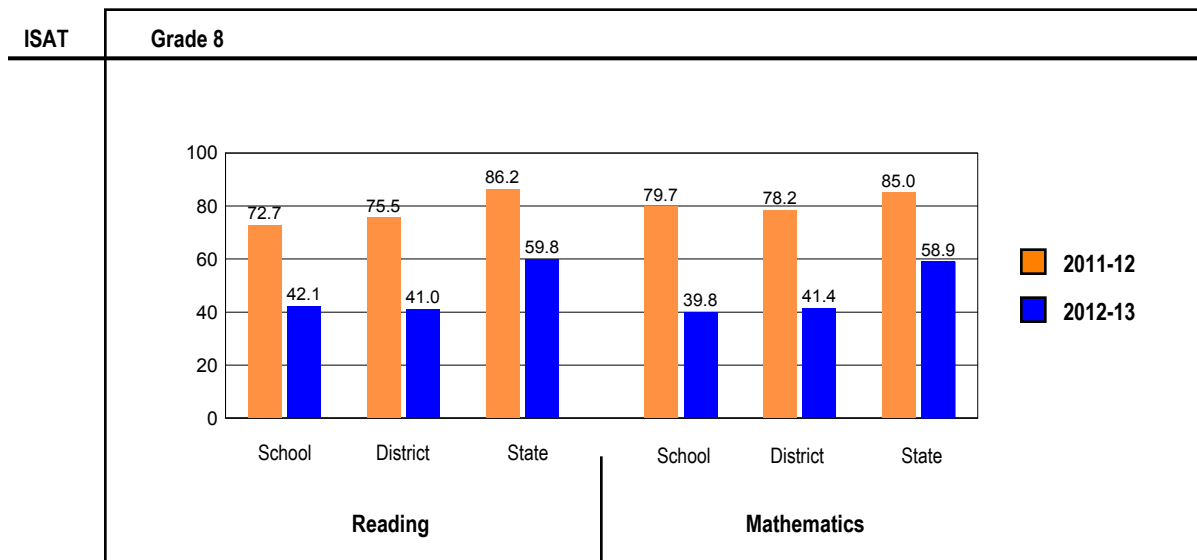
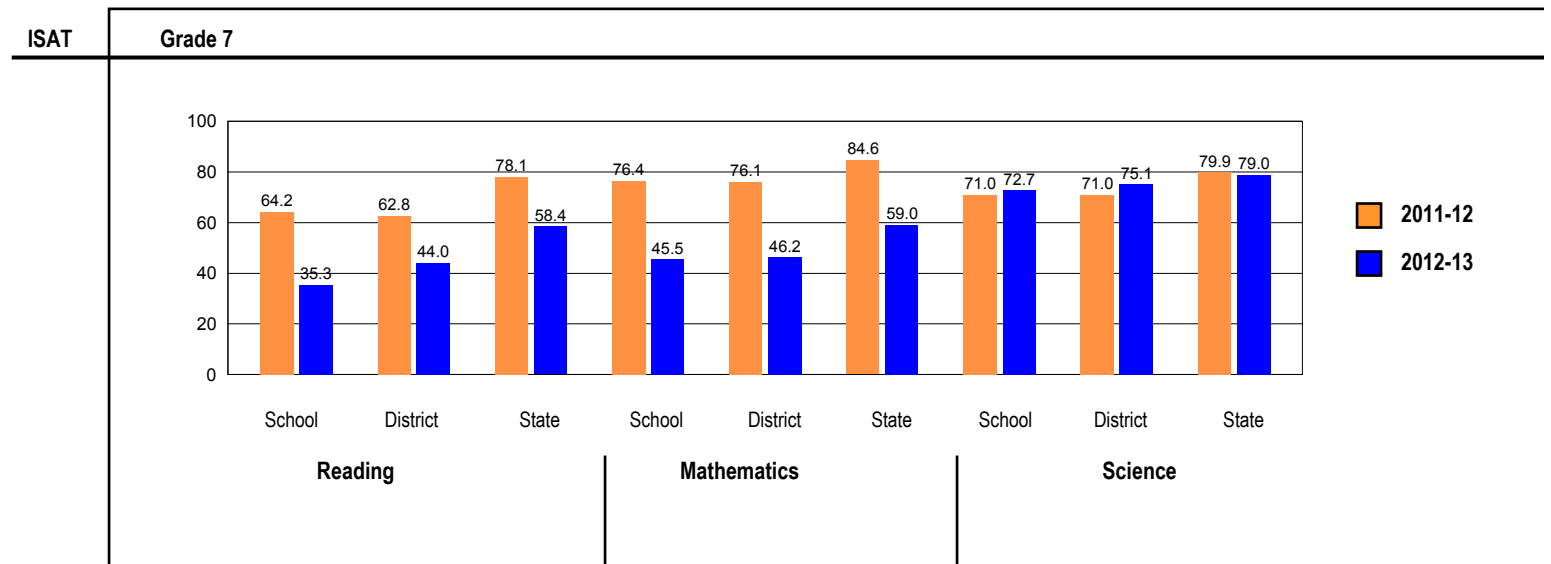
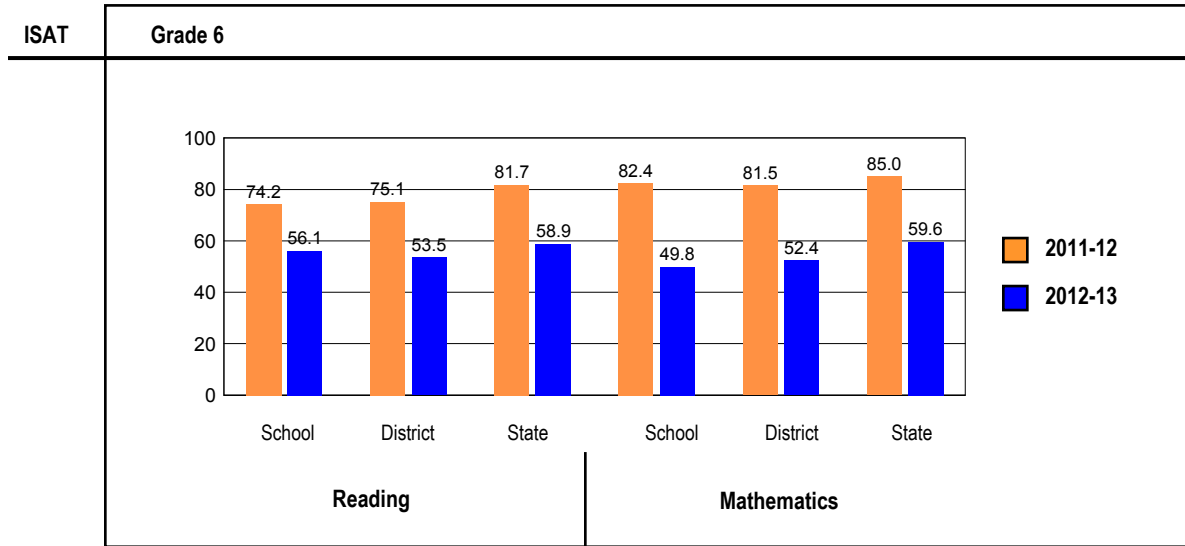




IAA scores in the Progressing and Attaining performance levels count the same, respectively, as scores on other state assessments that meet or exceed Standards.

ISAT PERFORMANCE

PERFORMANCE ON STATE ASSESSMENTS

Federal law requires that student achievement results for reading, mathematics, and science for schools providing Title I services be reported to the general public.

The Illinois Standards Achievement Test (ISAT) is administered to students in grades 3 through 8. The Prairie State Achievement Examination (PSAE) is administered to students in grade 11. The Illinois Alternate Assessment (IAA) is administered to students with disabilities whose Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) indicate that participation in the ISAT or PSAE would not be appropriate.

Students with disabilities have an IEP (No Child Left Behind Act). An IEP is a written plan for a child with a disability who is eligible to receive special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

Reading and Mathematics are tested in grades 3 through 8 and 11. Science is tested in grades 4, 7, and 11.

In order to protect students' identities, test data for groups of fewer than ten students are not reported.

ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT)

The following tables show the percentages of student scores in each of four performance levels. These levels were established with the help of Illinois educators who teach the grade levels and learning areas tested. Due to rounding, the sum of the percentages in the four performance levels may not always equal 100.

- Level 1 -- Academic Warning - Student work demonstrates limited knowledge and skills in the subject. Because of major gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills ineffectively.
- Level 2 -- Below Standards - Student work demonstrates basic knowledge and skills in the subject. However, because of gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills in limited ways.
- Level 3 -- Meets Standards - Student work demonstrates proficient knowledge and skills in the subject. Students effectively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems.
- Level 4 -- Exceeds Standards - Student work demonstrates advanced knowledge and skills in the subject. Students creatively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems and evaluate the results.

Four Conditions Are Required For Making Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP):

1. At least 95% tested in reading and mathematics for every student group. If the current year participation rate is less than 95%, this condition may be met if the average of the current and preceding year rates is at least 95%, or if the average of the current and two preceding years is at least 95%. Only actual participation rates are printed. If the participation rate printed is less than 95% and yet this school makes AYP, it means that the 95% condition was met by averaging.
2. At least 92.5% meeting/exceeding standards in reading and mathematics for every group. For any group with less than 92.5% meeting/exceeding standards, a 95% confidence interval was applied. Subgroups may meet this condition through Safe Harbor provisions. ***
3. At least 92% attendance rate for non-high schools.
4. At least 85% graduation rate for high schools. The State would first examine whether the school met the target for the four-year graduation rate.
